	 2. Access: a. All movement forward of the 800yd point must be coordinated and controlled by the Range Office and is to be via the gate to the left of the 800yd firing point. b. Access requires the following ranges to have ceased fire: i. Stickledown ii. Butt Zero iii. Melville iv. Sporting Rifle Ranges v. Pirbright vi. Short Siberia 	

	vii. Chobham Ridge
3.	 Vehicles: a. Are not permitted on the range floor without prior permission from the range office b. Butt markers vehicles are to be coordinated with Range Control prior to entry due to limited access and parking.
4.	 1200yd shooting is only permitted on targets 21 – 33 and 39 – 50 inclusive a. When shooting from lanes 46 - 50, a minimum of 10 target safety lanes is to be applied b. When shooting from lanes 21 – 33 and 39-45, a minimum of 8 target safety lanes is to be applied
5.	 Priority: a. If the NRA DOES NOT have priority (for Stickledown usage): Shooting at 1200yds is not permitted on lanes 29-33 and 39-50 Shooting at 1100yds on lanes 43-50 is not permitted
6.	1200yds shooting is not permitted if Butt Zero is in use
7.	 Gates: When firing is conducted at 1200yds: Cottesloe Heath Barrier between 900x and 1000x CLOSED 1200yd Firing Point Barrier CLOSED 'STOP! Live Fire' board in the appropriate position on the range to the rear of the 1100yd FP. Chain barrier on 1100yd track towards Clock Tower CLOSED

Any activity involving automatic fire d. Any use of semi-automatic firearms other than by government personnel on duty e. Fire and movement f. Engagement of hard targets
Firing positions	11. All firing is to be conducted from the left of pegs
	 12. Positions permitted: a. Prone b. Supine c. Benched d. Sitting, Kneeling, Standing (supported) for special events only or prior permission from the Range Office
	13. Permission to fire from any position other than prone/supine, or use a muzzle brake, must be notified in the booking request and granted by the Range Office in order to allow suitable target allocation on the range
Targetry	14. Unless prior permission has been obtained from the CE only targets from the NRA approved set may be used
	15. Targets are to be used in the frames or holders provided and are to be engaged only from the recognised firing points and /or appropriate shooting station or peg. Any deviation from this is to be notified, in writing, and approved by the Range Services Manager
	16. Laterally moving targets are not permitted on Gallery ranges
	17. Hard Targets:
	 a. NRA authorised events only b. Minimum engagement distance: 100m: High velocity firearms 25m: Solid slug 10m: .22 & pistol calibres & shotgun sizes above UK No4 to include Buckshot of max size OO v. 7m: No4 shot or smaller
