Coordinating Instructions	1. Shooting on this range affects the following ranges:  a. Stickledown  b. Century Butt 19 mantlet  2. Access:  a. The Butts are to be accessed via the Target Shed Road passage. Over the mantlet is not permitted  b. All firers must access the 200yd firing point from the car park passage across the range floor is not permitted  c. All shooting must cease to allow access to/from Stickledown Butts  d. Civil police are only allowed to shoot from a maximum distance of 40m with rifles and 14m with pistols where access to Stickledown is required or stop butt maintenance is occurring  3. Vehicles are not permitted on the range floor
	access to Stickledown is required or stop butt maintenance occurring

	<ol> <li>When shooting target shotgun at the left hand static targets the relevant butt target frames are to be removed from the cantilever frames and the frames fully lowered into the trough</li> </ol>
Firing Positions	All firing is to be conducted from the left of pegs
	10. Positions Permitted:  a. Prone b. Supine c. Sitting d. Kneeling/Squatting e. Standing f. Benched
	11. Lanes 1-4 are restricted to benched position only.
	12. Sporting stances on electronic targets are only permitted up to 100x
	13. Permission to fire from any position other than prone/supine, or use a muzzle brake, must be notified in the booking request and granted by the Range Office in order to allow suitable target allocation on the range.
	Changes of position are permitted within any detail or practice outside competition providing all firers follow the same sequence, and in competition in accordance with the conditions.
Targetry	15. Unless prior permission has been obtained from the CE only targets from the NRA approved set may be used
	16. Targets are to be used in the frames or holders provided and are to be engaged only from the recognised firing points and /or appropriate shooting station or peg. Any deviation from this is to be notified, in writing, and approved by the Range Services Manager
	Handheld targets are only to be exposed in or in front of target frames
	18. Handheld targets not supplied by the NRA require to be notified at the time of the booking due to possible frame removal
	19. Laterally moving targets are not permitted on Gallery ranges
	<ol> <li>Falling plates or other hard targets may not be engaged at a distance of less than 25yds (22 metres) without the permission of the CE</li> </ol>
	21. Users are not permitted to provide their own hard targets.
